Join leading international experts for the latest on equine performance, health and exercise in the lead up to London's Olympic Games 16th/17th June 2012 at Aintree Racecourse.

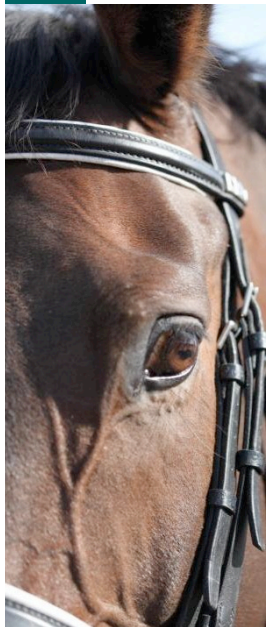

The Student Scientific Poster Competition is being organised as part of the scientific conference programme at ICEEP Aintree

How to Participate

We would like to invite all University and College Equine Departments to take part in the Student Poster Competition being held at the International Equine Exercise Physiology Conference – Winning Ways – in June 2012.

Each academic institution may submit up to three scientific posters from undergraduate or postgraduate (please specify) students, which will have been initially reviewed by internal academic staff.

There will be a preliminary judging by a panel of judges comprising of distinguished experts in the various disciplines of exercise physiology, nutrition, biomechanics and sports psychology. They will then select the finalists for the main competition at ICEEP, Winning Ways, Aintree, June 2012.

All finalists will receive substantially discounted conference registration. The finalists will have to be present at ICEEP Aintree 2012 for the finals of the scientific poster competition where they will present their poster and participate in a short Q&A session with the panel of judges.

All abstract(s) must be submitted in English. Online submission is preferred. Email submissions must be saved on Windows Microsoft Word document. The maximum number of words allowed is 250.

Deadline for submission of abstract(s) is Monday 20 Feb 2012 (23:59GMT+8). Please provide your email address together with your abstract so that we can send you the results of the preliminary judging and further poster presentation instructions. Abstract(s) accepted for presentation MUST be presented by registered participants at the main conference.

Poster Presentation

You are provided with a one-sided panel board with dimensions of 2m (width) x 1m (height), but not required to use up the entire space.

Posters will be displayed from 16th-17th June, 2012 during the allocated period. Authors are fully responsible for display and removal of their posters during the designated periods and at the respective locations. The Scientific Committee will not be liable for any loss or damage to the posters during the display.

Velcro tapes will be supplied by the organisers to mount the posters on the assigned panels. No nails are allowed on the panels.

When preparing text and illustrations, bear in mind that the posters will be viewed from a distance of about 1m.
